CATEGORIES


- 1. ORIGINAL SONG of entirely original words with original music or set to a traditional tune.
- 2. NEW TUNE / OLD WORDS an original tune for an existing poem.
- 3. DANCE, TUNE or AIR a new tune not intended as a song.
- 4. VERSE new rhymed verse not necessarily intended as a song.

CONDITIONS

- 1. Compositions should be based on an Australian theme.
- 2. Compositions should be written in a traditional Australian style.
- 3. Up to three entries per category per person may be submitted.
- 4. Entries should not have been published prior to January 2013
- 5. Copyright is retained by the author(s), but the Bush Music Club reserves the right to copy the material for its archives, and to publish the entries in Mulga Wire.
- 6. All entries must be received by Tuesday, 26th November 2013.
- 7. It is hoped that winning entries will be performed during the various events in 2014.
- 8. The following information should be included with each entry:
 - * Title of song, tune or verse
 - * Category of entry
 - * Name and address of composer (s)
 - * Contact email and/or phone number
 - * Age (if under 18)
 - * Number of entries submitted
- 9. To assist in judging, each entry should include both a recording of the entry and a transcription of the entry (words and music). It is helpful to have only one entry per recording.
- 10. There is no entry fee.
- 11. The prize in each category is \$100.

Patricia Early (17.3.1934 – 1.5.2013)

Patricia Early, one of Sydney's best known folk dance teachers, passed away on 1st May at St Joseph's hospice, aged 79. Although she was proud of her Irish heritage, and of being born in Ireland on St Patrick's Day, she was passionate about English Country dance. Lynette Hicks and Noreen Grunseit brought the dances back from England, and the Sydney Playford Dance Group was formed in the '70s by a few people, Patricia among them. When age and ill health meant that Lynette and Noreen could no longer teach, Patricia



kept the group going. She also taught English Country dance at Wesley School for Seniors.

Gulgong Folk Festival, at New Year, acquired a reputation as a festival for dancers because Patricia took on the task of getting dance into the program, and organising workshop presenters. She also produced a Music Hall night in the Gulgong Opera House, unearthing some previously unknown talents in many of the performers. But dance was only one of Patricia's interests. She liked singing at sessions, and reciting comic poems - and did so, at Toongabbie Music Club. She played piano accordion and was a member of bush bands for many years. She often entertained in nursing homes, taking her dog (she always had one) along with her. She served some time on the committee of the Folk Federation of NSW.

Besides organising musical afternoons at her home, some years ago she added a second storey, to have a room dedicated to dance. It became an occasional venue for the Playford group, and for social dance gatherings. In the last year of her life it gradually became impossible for her to get up the stairs; but she was still happy for others to dance up there.

Patricia had come home from the hospice for a day or two in March, to spend her birthday at home, and eat and sing with friends - and she regarded that as her "wake". She wanted to be there for it! Nevertheless, more friends gathered at the Bush Music Club, to share memories, and to sing and dance and play, following her funeral at Rookwood Crematorium on 10th May - where, at her request, folk dance and song formed part of the service.

Patricia was very good hearted and gave generously of her time to support folk music and dance in Sydney. She was one of the presenters of the Folk Federation's folk music show, Focus on Folk, on 2MBS-FM (now Fine Music 102.5), and also volunteered at the station. She encouraged others to come forward and develop their skills in many areas including dance teaching. Those few people who might have been disconcerted by her occasionally gruff manner usually found that Patricia would go to great lengths to help and support them. She really did have a heart of gold and will be sadly missed in the Sydney folk scene. Julie & Alex Bishop
