AGM - Treasurer's Report

Profit and Loss

The Bush Music Club operated with a surplus of \$4849.00 for the year which included Interest from Investments of \$3733.91.

The diminution in operating surplus during 2014 was mainly due to expenditure on activities related to the 60th Anniversary of the club. Income from 60th functions to-talled \$2978.05 whilst expenditure was \$6682.40.

The Heritage Ball at Parramatta, the Maitland Ball, Beecroft, Ermington dances and the Pennant Hills Workshop all contributed surplus funds to the club.

Balance Sheet

Club assets total \$125,998.07 which include investments in ANZ, Westpac and Commonwealth Bank Term Deposits of \$119,753.65, a small stock of books and other items for sale together with cash at bank and cash floats for dances. The club had no liabilities as at 31 December 2014.

BMC members Ralph Pride and Helen and Tony Romeo assisted with technical/musical aspects and Lola joined Concert Party work-shops at Bulli & the National!

At the Illawarra Folk Festival we ran our usual Songs and Tunes workshops, and made our usual appearance at the Australian Traditions/ Alan Scott concert.

We ran our first Saplings workshops for young musicians & would-be musicians at the National Folk festival, unfortunately in the Children's Festival area, so older musicians did not attend, but those who did had a great time. We ran successful Songs & Tunes workshops

We were well represented at Turning Wave (songs, tunes and John Dengate Memorial Concert) & Kangaroo Valley Festivals (Songs, tunes, dances, Tune Swap with No Such Thing, and Saplings) and had a much larger than usual presence at the October Bush Traditions Gathering.

Members also participated in the John Dengate memorial concert at Cobargo.

Duke's Place - Australian Songs in Concert & session had a successful year, with average attendances of 21 per concert. Door money went to performers, with several refusing the money so we banked \$310.

The Songwriting workshop with Phyl Lobl was successful, attracting 6 members and non members, and will be repeated in 2015.

Our Member's Dinner in March and Concert/Dance/Reunion in November attracted a large proportion of our members and went well, and like all activities in our Diamond Jubilee year, would not have been the success they were without the work of all our volunteers.
