## HISTORY

Over the years the club has undergone many changes, both in membership and in activities. We have recently been doing some long overdue maintenance work on the BMC hut which has required the removal of the posters that have adorned the walls for many years. The reason for the posters being on the wall was revealed clearly when they were removed. They were pasted to the walls to cover up various holes in the wall sheeting, as a kind of cheap wallpaper. This was not an unusual practice in those days.

The walls have now been properly repaired with pieces of replacement sheeting and then painted. The posters, which were just considered scrap paper at the time they were used, are now being properly preserved and have also been photographed. What was once a piece of scrap is now a piece of history.




Singabout
